Hi All,

Quite an eventful week end. Ruby's concert was a great success, and provided yet another of those delightful community events that is one of the charms of living in Winsham. More pictures can be seen by clicking on Ruby's picture at the head of the E-Letter.

At this stage I am going to claim 'bragging rights' on behalf of the Jubilee Hall Management Committee .

It was a source of great satisfaction at the concert to sit comfortably in our beautiful hall and see all the equipment and services installed over the last few years being used as intended. The digital piano was being played by expert musicians, sounding, to a layman such as myself, at least as good as a concert grand piano, but provided at a small fraction of the cost, and no tuning required!

Broadband and the Digital projector also came into their own, providing images of the Choralia Choir of which Ruby is a member, via YouTube.

This is the future for village halls. As our youngsters grow up, this is what they will expect, and in providing these facilities now, Winsham are way ahead of most small halls in Somerset, and also one of the lowest cost halls to book.

More good news about the Jubilee Hall-it is soon to become even more comfortable. This winter it will be warmer. 'Awards for All' have awarded a grant of £9,000 to replace the two Critall Windows with double glazed units (as well as the small window to the front of the Parish Council Office). The work will be carried out sometime in October. They will look good too. They will be framed in hardwood, painted white, and their appearance will be similar to the original windows installed in 1887. Planning approval has been obtained, and needed, as we are in a conservation area.

Also in the e-letter this week are pictures taken in the Ornamental Garden at Ebben Lane earlier to-day. Jan and I went about lunch time and it was very pleasant experience. Martyn and Fiona England have developed the two and a half acre wood into a delightful retreat. Unfortunately numbers of visitors were

not as high as were hoped for, but the event did raise £80 for the Air Ambulance service. Let's hope that this will become a regular event-well worth going to see.
