This relates especially to the areas dealing with people's memories of Winsham in days' past . These are more easily accessed from the Home Page browsing index.

There is also a very good and, as far as I know, unique view of Winsham and Church Street on the Home Page, taken by Chris Beer. Perhaps he has a drone, or grown a pair of wings! (There is also a lovely picture of a roe deer that he took very recently near the river, which now adorns the Parish Notice board web page).

The Web Museum Site Map has yet to be updated. It will takes ages to complete, but meanwhile it remains useful.

There are also some changes in the indexing of Winsham History; the Historic Houses, and Jubilee Hall now have direct access from the Home Page.

There is also a programme of tidying-up many pages within all sections of the Museum-correcting spelling mistakes, punctuation, repairing broken links, etc. and this will be ongoing through the next twelve months. This has started and I am rediscovering areas that I had not visited for quite a while (or completely forgotten about), and I will include some of these in the weekly 'mystery' tours!

One other bit of news about Winsham on the Web-The Winsham Parish Web Site, as well as the Web Museum, has been archived by the British Library, ensuring access by scholars, etc for many years to come.
