Hi All,

Two important news items this week, both requiring prompt action if you feel that they are relevant to you.

The first is that High Speed Broadband services are available to subscribers in Winsham, but with limited availability. What exactly this means I do not know.

I discovered all this by accident on Friday morning, when I was called by a BT sales person to review my account with BT. I asked when were we going to get the fast broadband service we had been promised. He said he would enquire. A couple of minutes later he came back with the news that the service is now available. After going through the costs involved, which were not much different to what I am paying at present, I confirmed that I wanted the service. I get connected on the 24th January, with an estimated download speed of 53-55Mbits/sec-a big improvement on the 6-7Mbits/sec I get at present. Uploading will be about 10Mbits/sec.

I said that I would distribute the news to the parish via our e-letter, when he said that there was limited availability, on a first come first served basis. Clearly he was only talking about BT, but presumably this will also apply to other service providers. If you want it, don't delay. Get onto your service provider right away.

The other important news item is that the plans for the integration of 'The Bell' with Winsham Shop are progressing well, with a second presentation being made on Wednesday, 4th January by Paula Bramley Ball, of the Winsham Shop's Management Committee, to a fair sized audience. Following this a further statement has been published urging people to get their pledges of support into her as soon as possible. Click on the e-Letter link below.

On an entirely different matter, 'The Bell' are organising their annual 'Burns Night' celebration for January, 27th January. Like the broadband, book now to avoid disappointment!
