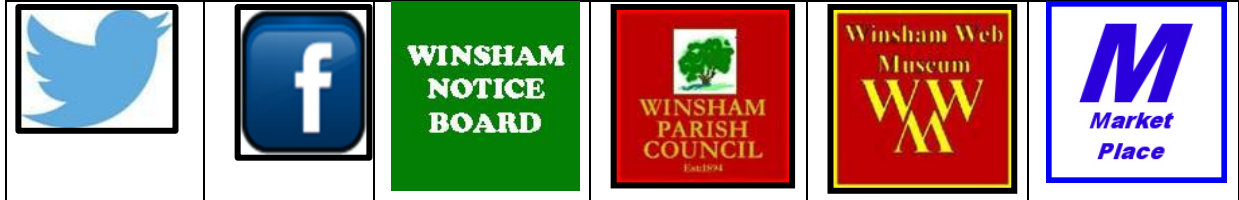


WINSHAM E-LETTER

Hi All,

Because of the Corona Virus Emergency, practically all our community activity plans for the next few months have been put on hold, and most of the village resources have been temporarily closed. The exceptions are Winsham Shop and Post Office and The Bell. Despite being unable to operate as a pub, The Bell is

continuing to provide off license sales, takeaway and home delivered hot food, and supplying, to order, uncooked meat and vegetables.

How fortunate we are to have these two important resources still available to us.

I should also like to thank, on behalf of all of us, Winsham Parish Council, and Winsham Shop Management Committee for the tremendous amount of work they have put in to ensure that all Winsham's residents, particularly the elderly and those at special risk from the Corona Virus, are protected as much as is possible from infection.

Both organisations have had a difficult time in recent years, but the new Parish Council, a new and inexperienced team, under the Chairmanship of Stuart Davies, and with the support of Rose Richards, our new Parish Clerk, have risen magnificently to a challenge which was unimagined less than twelve months ago, when they were all newly elected at the 'hustings'. The Winsham Shop Management has been unbelievably resilient after many setbacks, but are as dynamic as ever.

Give credit where credit is due.

We have no option but to make the best of the present situation- but **it will pass**- hopefully by the end of Summer-maybe sooner.

With the many entertainments and diversions removed, just think of all those jobs around the house you can now find time for; all the cupboards and drawers that are long overdue a tidy, and that bit of decorating. We can also take the opportunity to phone friends who we haven't spoken to for a while. Why not make that start on that new hobby which we have not had the time to get going on. YouTube is a good place to begin!

Get outside, if you have a garden, and are fit enough, and start 'digging for Britain'-grow a few vegetables! If you have young children, get them to do the digging, and show them how to plant and nurture seeds. All this takes me back to my childhood during the War!

One good thing that has come out of all this- there is hardly a word in the media about Global Warming, our exit from the EU, or Isis!

It seems that most of the steps have now been taken that can be taken to minimise the spread of Corvid-19. So now is the time for those of us who fall into 'vulnerable categories' because of age or pre-existing medical conditions, or both, to consider how we can be practical and sensible about self imposed and social isolation.

For those in these categories, and who are not working, we owe it to other residents of Winsham to follow the ideas that have been set out by Government. It comes down to the less we physically interact with one and other, and the world outside our homes, the less likely we are to become victims. Jan and I still go to the shop, but we do not linger, and we wear latex gloves. When the infection comes to Winsham, perhaps sooner, we will most likely ask for groceries to be delivered. We each have to make our own decisions on these matters. Thank goodness for an almost cashless society.

One thing we should carry in mind-if as individuals we are inclined to take risks, and as a result we become infected, we then inevitably become a carrier with the ability to infect others. To say nothing of the unpleasant and potentially lethal infection we will have to suffer.

We then become a burden and source of worry to our families, and the NHS, who need all their resources to support the general population, some of whom are still working despite being vulnerable due to pre-existing conditions.

Remember, we have all sorts of ways of communicating with one and other without any risk. Phone, Skype, text messaging, e-mail and all sorts of social media. So it is not that difficult.
