Parish web site

Winsham School and pre-school

Broadly speaking we will be guided by Community Council for Somerset on best practice. However, our instincts are that we will not be able to get into business before

late summer / early autumn. This will be decided by demand, linked to future relaxations in the rules, resulting from better progress in controlling the virus than can be predicted at present.

We know that many people are keen for the Jubilee Café to restart as soon as possible, and our committee are also anxious to bring this about. However, we do not see how this can be done while practising social distancing or wearing masks. Rest assured we will do everything we can to safely re-open the Jubilee Hall as soon as possible.

One cause for excitement! We are planning to hold our Annual General Meeting in September; only four months late!! All residents will be welcome.

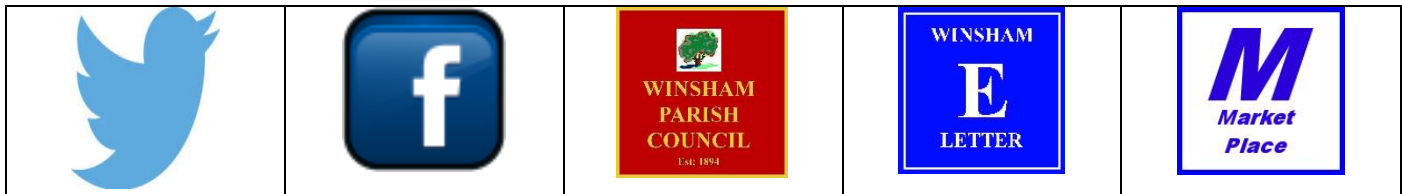


