Winsham Street Fair

The first item relates to this year's Winsham Street Fair. Sadly, but not unexpectedly, it has been postponed until next year. Although most of the news about Covid-19 and the vaccination programme is positive, there is still a good deal of uncertainty, especially with regards to its variants, so it does make sense. A lot of work goes into the organisation of the event, so a measure of certainty is needed. One thing I am sure of; when the next Street Fair does next come about it is sure to be mean something incredibly special to all of us.

Joint Parish Magazine

Regarding next month's Joint Parish Magazine, if there is no lifting of the appropriate Lockdown restrictions, for Winsham it will be printed and distributed in the same way as February-mainly via the Shop, newspapers, etc. The Joint Parish Magazine will also appear online.

Many of the readers of the e-letter subscribe the £ 4.50 pa which, in normal times, ensures that they get their copy delivered to their home each month. However, the temporary suspension of the normal delivery service, during the Lockdown, does enable those of our readers who do not get the magazine on a regular basis , sometimes those new to the village, to view and read it free of charge. This opportunity will not last beyond the Lockdown, so it is an ideal occasion to sample its content and experience its breadth of coverage, and of course make use of its 'Yellow Pages' which contain the ads of many local suppliers of goods and services. It is incredible value, only made possible, like so many of the benefits within the parish, because of the tireless efforts of a big team of volunteers covering both editorial, delivery and other services. The only professional service used is the actual printing. The local advertisers also benefit directly from this, as the costs of advertising reflect this.
