For years, this space has been called the 'Lower Rec'. It seems to me a very ordinary name for such a nice spot, so I, propose to refer to it from now on as the Village Green. I remember when I was a small boy living in inner London there was a street named Morris Road by Wandsworth Borough Council, many years earlier. The street nameplates confirmed this. Nobody could give me a sensible explanation for this. I expect many readers have similar memories. Possibly it was the unconscious rejection by locals of an action by an 'early woke' local authority who were more interested in honouring perhaps one of their number, than reflecting local history!

Along with others, I also suggest that we should adopt a new name for the 'Upper Rec.' Perhaps the newly formed Winsham Recreational Trust could give some thought to this. 'Winsham Field' has been suggested as a nice, simple name. What are your views on these matters?

Who knows, renaming might even discourage people who allow their dogs to foul these areas (and other parts of our pleasant village). Perhaps that is too much to hope for.
