At present the parish council has asked for seven amendments to be made to this application. The Council would then put forward their views when this had been done.

Neighbourhood Watch – Mr. Crowden reported that 360 copies had been produced of the latest bulletin and had been circulated. He had attended a meeting on the 19<sup>th</sup> July in Ilminster where the new Chief Constable of Avon and Somerset had been present. The Chairman thanked Mr. Crowden for attending and updating Councillors.

Footpaths – Mr. Shaw informed Councillors that the work had been carried out as per the list attached to the minute book.

- Wooden Bier this was now installed in the barn belonging to Mr. Hammet and was protected by cloths and plastic sheets. The shed is locked and the bier is in a safe place for the time being. Mr. Jefferies had done some repairs but some more will need doing at a future date.

- c) Barrier at Winsham School to be put on the October agenda. This will be discussed at the next Governors' meeting which falls before the October Parish Council meeting.
- d) Dog Bin siting of. Mrs. Duke to contact the dog warden to see how often the Bin is emptied. All councillors to check out various sites and report back in October. Action by Hazel Duke and all Councillors.
- e) Sign for United Reform Church this to be a simple black and white sign, a further report in October.
- f) Hedge Obstructions in the Parish Mr. Sherrin of Court Farm had now cut back his hedge as had Mrs. Duffell of Oakgates. The Clerk to write and thank both these people.
  Concern was expressed at the encroachment of back boundaries from 1 to 8 Fore Street and The Manse onto the Highway. The Clerk to write to all of these and ask them to check the rear of their properties.

Windwhistle – junction has been Improved. Exit now the normal exit since the hotel has opened. Felt that safety aspects have not been fully dealt with. Large junction signs totally unnecessary.

The next agenda for Area West will have a confidential piece applying to Winsham. This is regarding 11 to 12 acres of land which it is hoped Area West will purchase for a wild life site.
