Meeting held in the Jubilee Hall on Friday, 1st March 1985 at 8.00p.m.

Ten Village Organisations were representated. An apology for absence was received from the Art Club. Five organisations were not representated.

A letter has been received from a Mrs P Townsend of Kingsbury Episcopi offering to run childrens amusements (roundabout and inflatable castle) on 29th June. Her offer will be accepted.

A reply has been received from Mr R Gouldsworthy, The County Tourist Officer, saying that he cannot assist Winsham in connection with the group purchase of souvenirs.

The Womens Institute will serve Tea and Coffee in the Hall. The Band will not be performing but will run the Skittles.

The P.C.C. will have a flower arrangement and an exhibition in the Church.

The School will have Maypole Dancing and an exhibition of period dressed figures and a game with a bladder.

The Royal British Legion and the Over 60's Club will run stalls selling cakes etc:. As near the Hall as possible.

The Playgroup will have children walking around the Village with fruit, posies and buttonholes and may help with ploughman's lunches.

The Youth Club are prepared to help to raise money beforehand with sponsorships and will have a stall on the day.

The Cricket Club will run the Stocks.

The West Somerset Morris Dancers have quoted a fee of £40-50, if they attend.

The following was agreed:

- 1. That £5 should be charged to outside organisations and £2 to Village Organisations for a stall space.
- 2. That the Street Fair should be advertised in the Press as soon as possible and that an application form should be prepared for stall holders to complete and return with their fee.
- 3. That a rain insurance should be taken out.
- 4. That the Police Superintendent at Yeovil should be approached about the presence of a Constable.
- 5. That the Village should be fully informed and information on the pattern of dress provided. See Mrs Loaring & Mr. Bannen.
- 6. That local Craftspeople Potter, Thatcher etc., should be approached.
- 7. That the name of the Chard Town Crier be established with the aim of him judging a possible Crier's Competition on 29th June.

Mr Harvie is preparing various signs for use on the day. Mr Vincent has determined the route of Monmouth's men through the Village.
Mrs Pargiter will be reminded about the Mummers.

Minutes.

The minutes of the meeting on 1st March were signed as a true record, with the exception of the item on the W.I. They will serve Tea and Coffee outside the Hall and not inside.

The Clerk announced 13 stallholders had applied for bookings. No booking forms were yet to hand. Mr Smart said these will be supplied shortly.

Mrs Payne assumes that their display will be sited outside the School. This was agreed.

The subject of Public Toilets was raised. It was suggested that the School facilities might be used, also those of the Jubilee Hall. This will be pursued. It was also suggested that a Portaloo should be hired. This will also be investigated.

The Clerk was asked to approach the Municipal Mutual Insurance Ltd re. Public Liability Insurance.

It was agreed that advertising should be increased. Mr R Smart and Mr E Bannen will deal with this. Notices will be prepared for delivery down to door.

The Art Club are producing Posters as a project. It was suggested the best one should be reproduced for general distribution.

Period Dress. Photocopies of details obtained by the Clerk were handed to those present. More explanatory drawing are available upon request. The possibility of hiring period dress was mentioned.

It was proposed that there should be an 'entry of the Army into the Village' Mrs Rose volunteered to obtain help and recruit an 'Army' for this purpose. Mrs Thompson suggested that perhaps horses should be involved.

Mr Smart stated that no Morris Dancers were available so he had booked a team of Lady Clog Dancers. They can perform in the morning only. There will be no charge.

Other suggestions:The Vicar should be pulled 'forcibly'from the Pulpit.
Music will be provided by Wandering Minstrels.
The Winsham Band will provide a drummer to accompany the 'Army' march.
The Church Bells will be rung during the day.
A Play will be performed - no details available.

There will be a Handbell Display - organised by Miss G Grabham. A programme will be published and a large copy displayed in the Village. Tables and Chairs can be hired from the Jubilee Hall.

Car Parking. Car Park attendants to be recruited. Possible sites for car parks were discussed. Mr Smart will contact the owners of the fields which were suggested.

It was decided not to take out rain insurance.

St John's Ambulance Service is to be contacted and asked to send a Team for the day.

It was announced that all organisations must obtain approval from the Committee for anything being planned.

Re: the Bladder Game - it was decided to make this a pastime between teams of children. Mrs Loaring will give a trophy to the winning team.

Miss Loaring announced that the Cricket Club have the stocks.

Mrs Penny Pargiter is to be contacted regarding the Play.

Mr J Loaring has seen Mr G Grabham about ringing the Church Bells.

The Jubilee Hall is available for an exhibition.

Mrs M Loaring suggested a Folk Group and will contact the 'Stringers Isle' for a quotation to perform for a few hours during the day.

Photographers are to be asked to cover the events.

Mr Smart asked for a volunteer to list all the different catering activities to make sure the whole day was covered - no volunteer.

The Play Group will serve Coffee from 10 a.m. as well as Ploughmans Lunches.

The W.I. will serve Teas in the afternoon.

There will be food and drinks at Davies Close Community Lounge, the Bell Inn and the Sports and Social Club.

Tables for Local Organisations who have asked for one, will be booked by Mr E Bannen.

Mrs M Fowler said there are tables at the Chapel and suggested Mr Hebditch should be contacted re: hiring.
